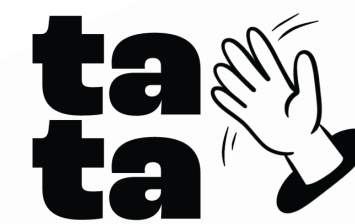

01 The Idea

The Purpose/Objective

The primary objective was to design something simple, fun, and memorable for my classmates who graduate this quarter. I wanted to encapsulate everyone's experiences at SCAD through this gift, providing them with something that they can take back with them and reminisce about in the years to come.

02 Information Collection

I began the process by sending out a Google Form to all my classmates with a variety of questions ranging from basic questions to more fun ones. I moved all the data to an Excel sheet to make it easier for me to make sense of the information.

Questions related to meals & breaks at SCAD

Questions related to professors & specific classes

Questions related to design, fonts etc.

Questions related to personality traits as students of SCAD

03 Ideation

03 Ideation

Idea 1:

Why this didn't work:

Since it is digital, it felt less personal and more like a chore for them to access it and read it.

Idea 2:

- a photo/video series with clips from SCAD, from our final GDVX 749 class, and short snippets of the students talking (re-doing the questionnaire as an in-person recorded survey)
- Designed and edited polaroid portrait photographs of themselves, accompanied by a visual summary of their experiences

Why this didn't work:

The idea seemed to be impractical and somewhat unnatural, because the students would know that they are being video captured. I wanted it to be natural and a surprise.

Idea 3:

- a small package
- the information gathered about the students' experience would take the form of a fun, light-hearted infographic
- it is printed out, customized and handed out to each student for them to take back home with them

Why this was chosen:

It is personal. It is customized. It is something that is real and printed, and can be taken back home.

03 Ideation

I went through a rather confusing process of what to name the package. I started with “Rocky Road” with an intention of saying that “It has been a rocky road, but we succeeded together”, but that sounded unpleasant. I went through a series of other names as well before I finally decided on the final one.

Why this didn't work:

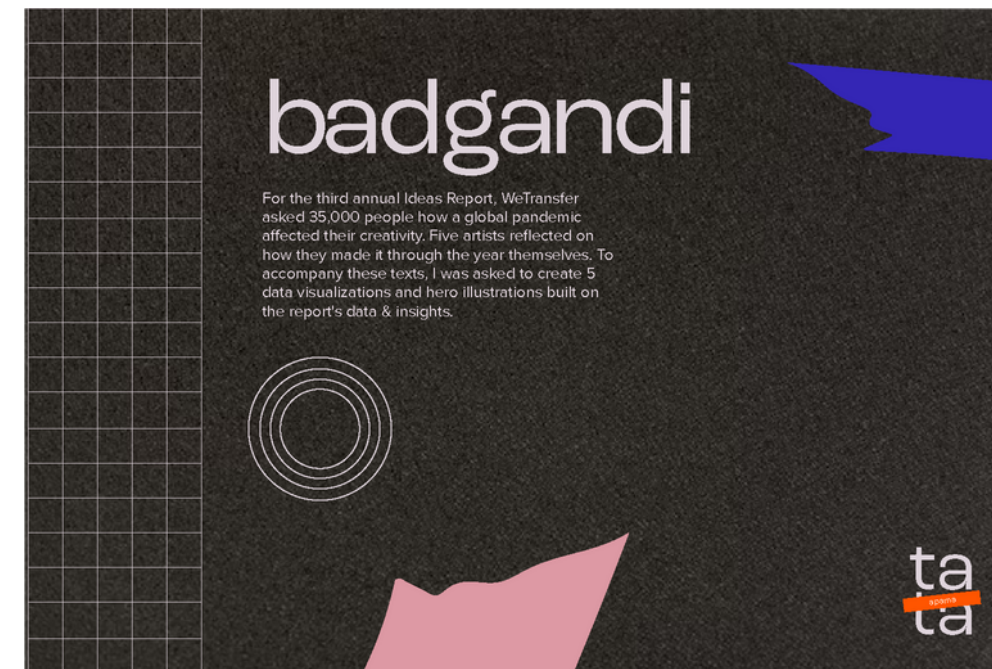
This name didn't sound too positive. The color palette seemed “corporate” and rigid. It didn't feel light-hearted.

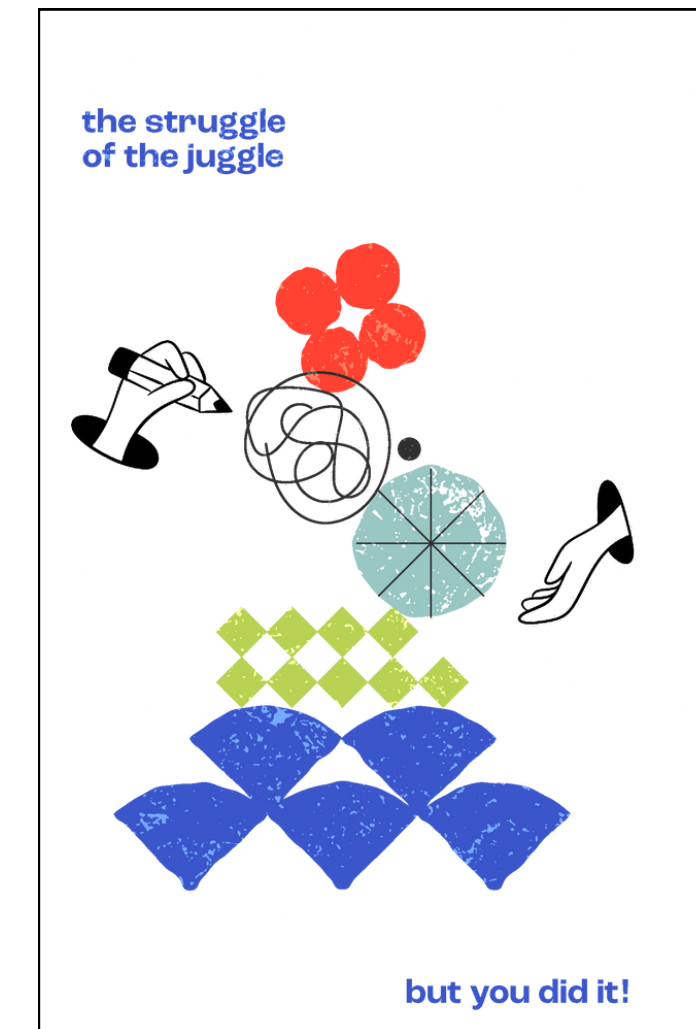
Why this didn't work:

After going through several visual directions, I had a better idea about what the logo should look like.



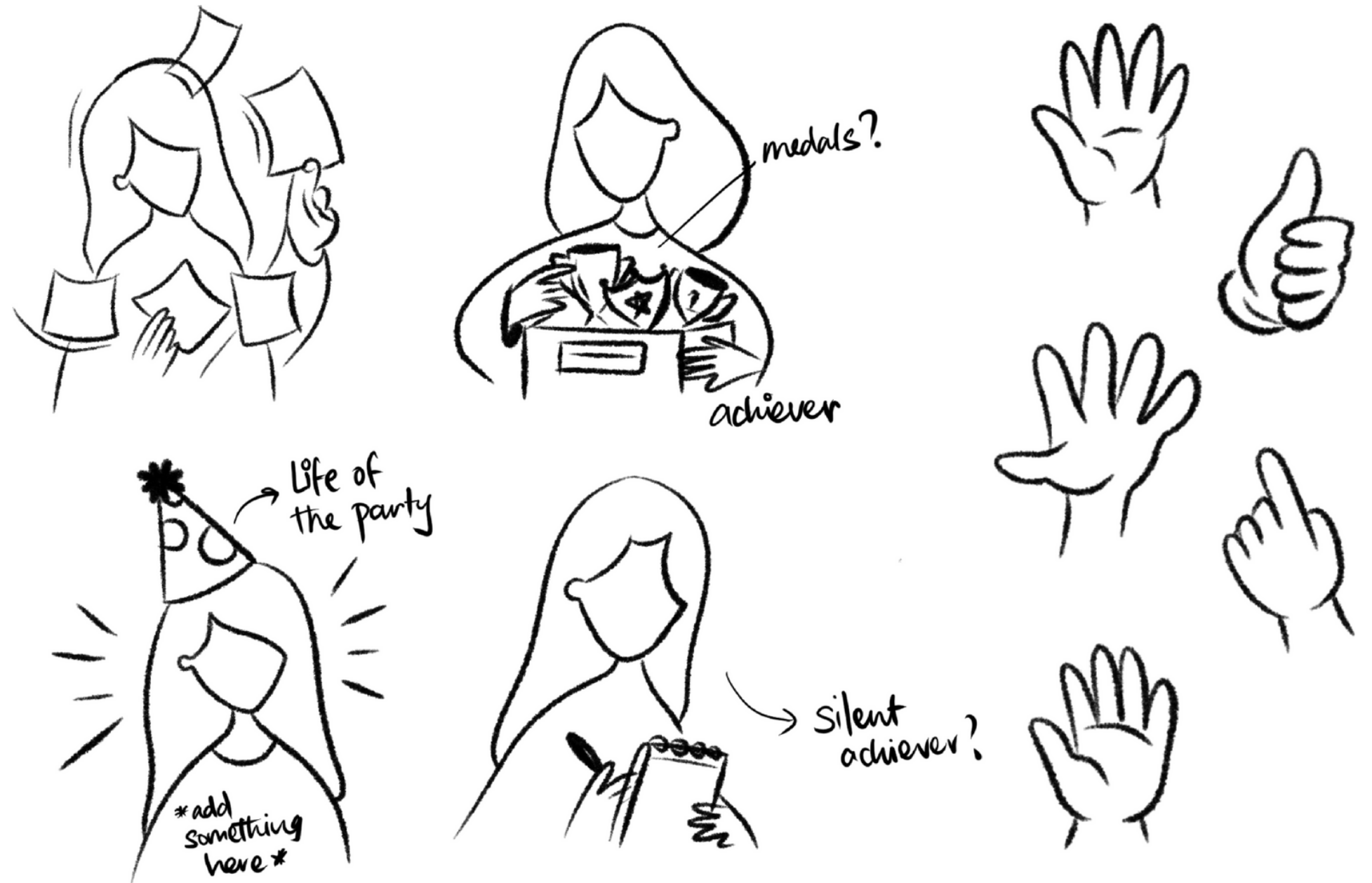

The choice of the name "ta ta" was made because it means "Goodbye," but carries a less somber tone. I decided to incorporate hand-drawn illustrations and motifs sketched by me throughout the package to make it feel more personal.

I did not want to carry forward the *hand-drawn sketches* theme into the infographics, so I came up with a set of shapes, lines, and patterns to be used for the infographic, while still matching with the rest of the visuals.

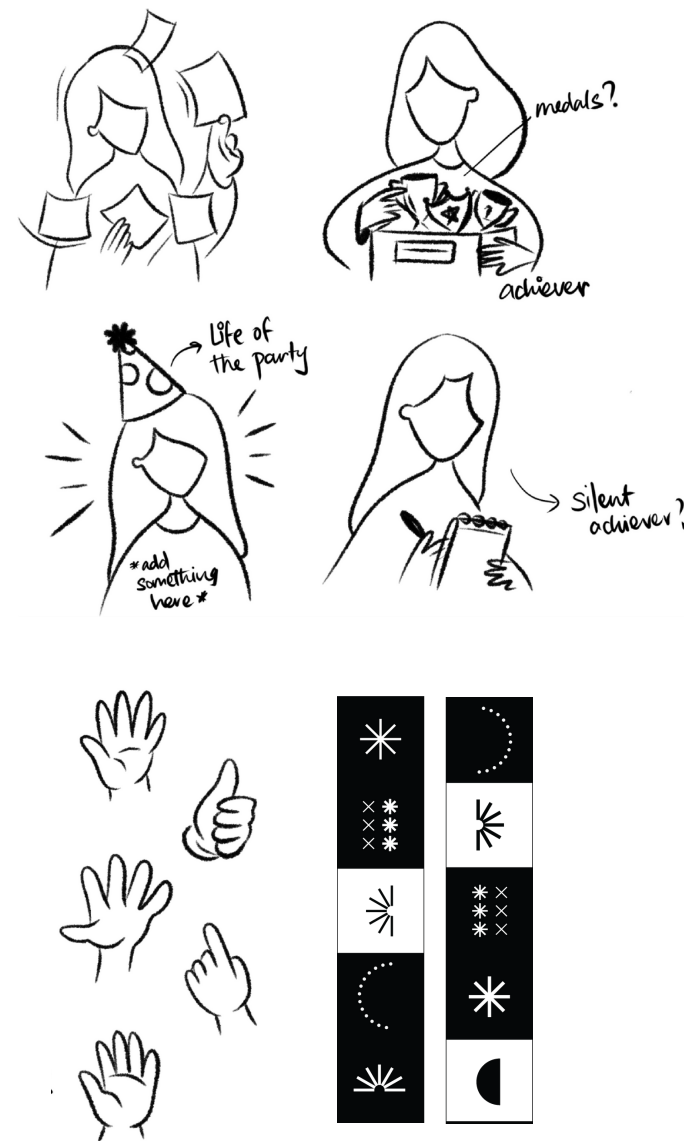

04 The Design

This is the structure of the infographic. I wanted it to be in the shape of a “capsule” to metaphorically show that it capsulizes their experience here at SCAD. Each layer of the capsule displays a different piece of information denoted by the “key”, which is also provided in the package.

= No. of quarters

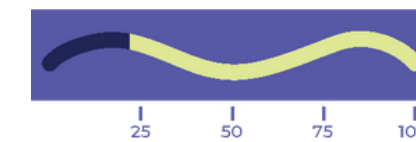


Orange symbols = How often you were late to class

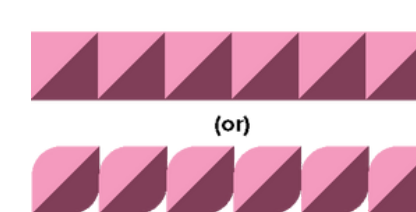
no symbol

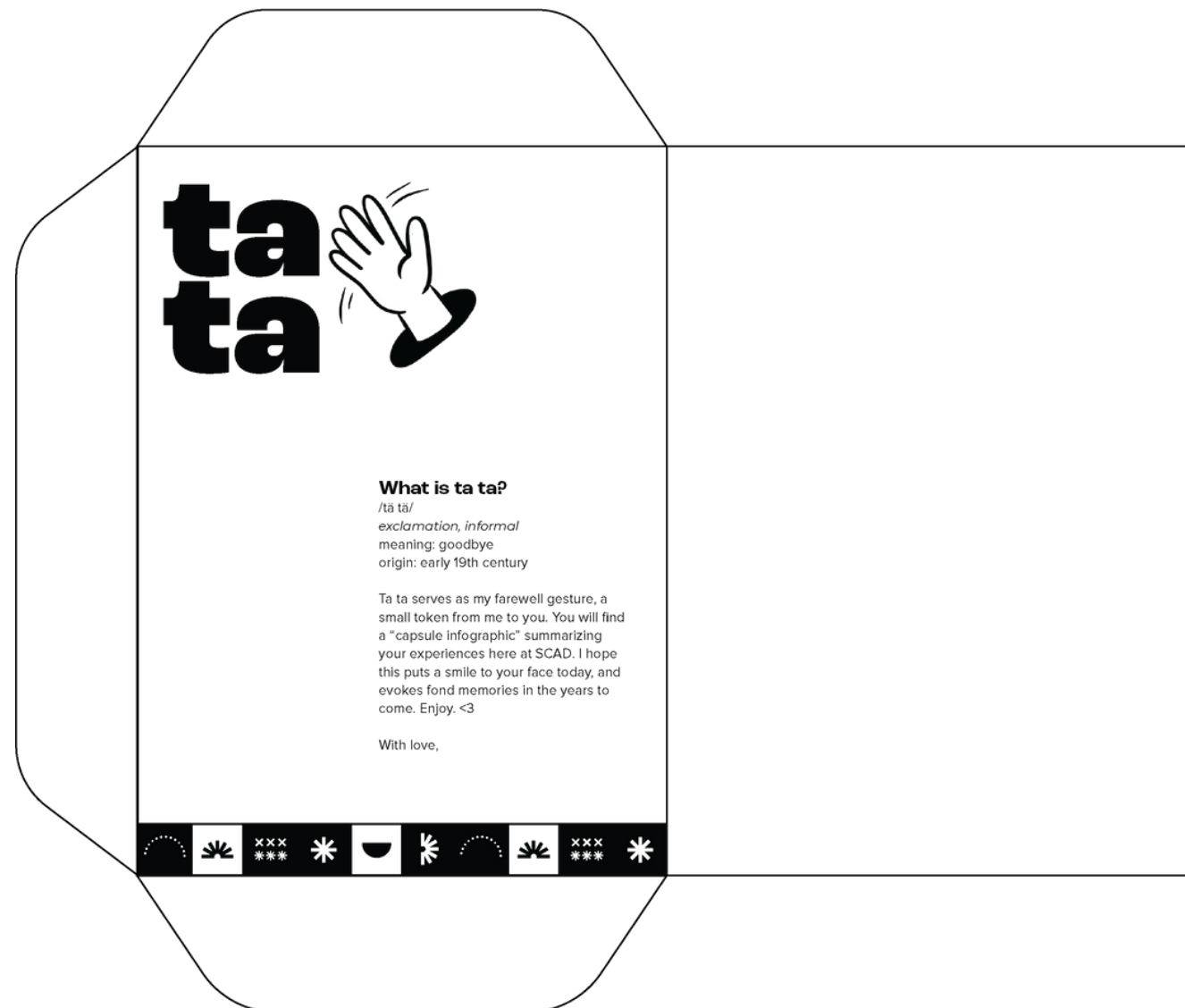

Once I got all the material printed, I began putting them together in their respective envelopes. I wanted to write “With love, *my signature*” on each of the envelopes to make it feel more personal.



05 Photography

Photography being a huge passion of mine, I really enjoyed this part of the process. These were the types of images I wanted to capture of the package:

- Against a plain background, with natural lighting (sunlight)
- Close-ups of parts of the package (to emphasize on the logo placement, and the blurb)
- Neatly arranged parts of the package (for practical purposes; for the viewer to understand what the package contains)
- Chaotic images (with the package and the cards randomly arranged)
- PEOPLE. I wanted to capture initial reactions of reading through information inside the package.

Card 1

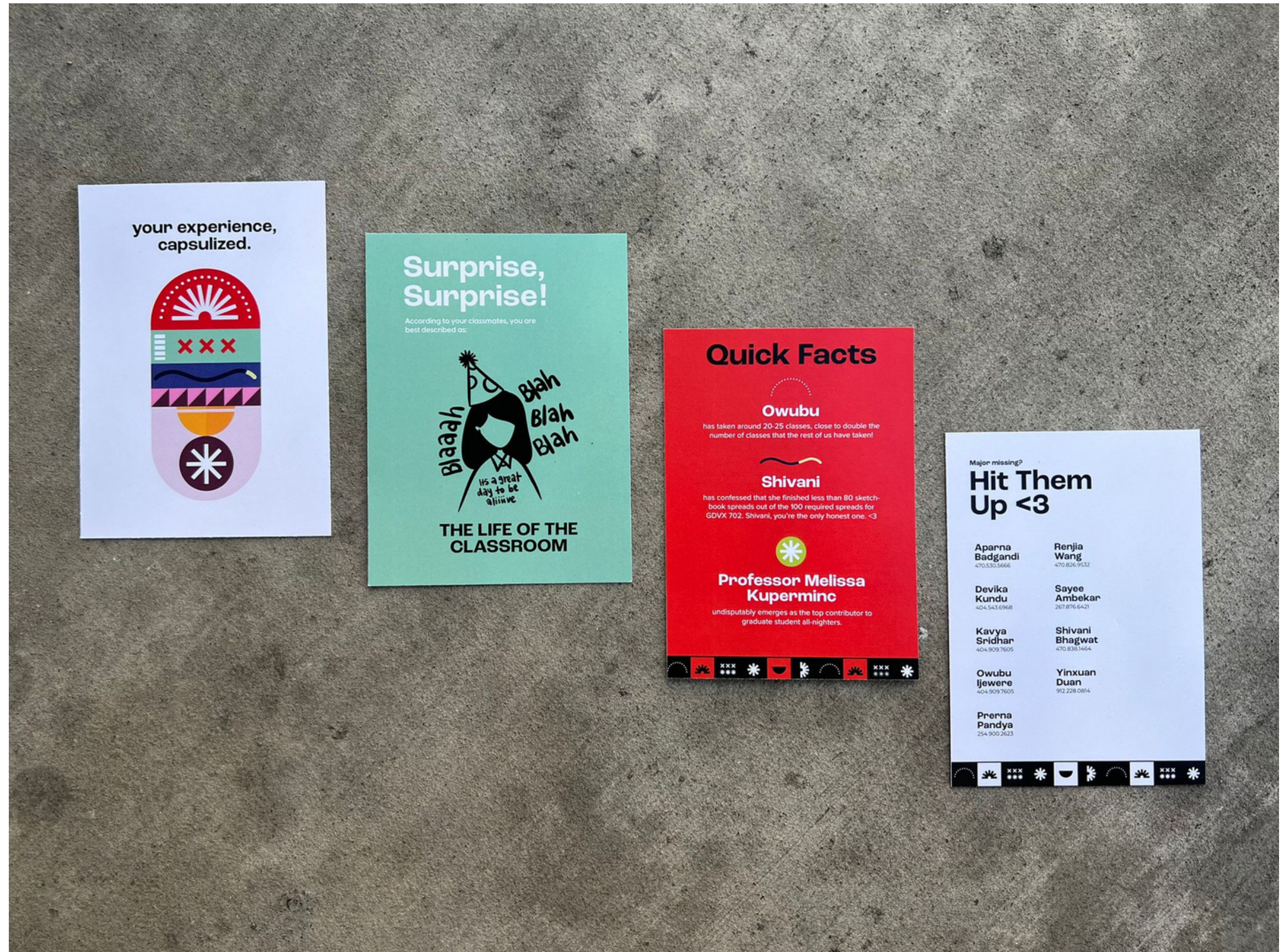
Front: a custom infographic for each student that capsulizes a few key points from their SCAD journey

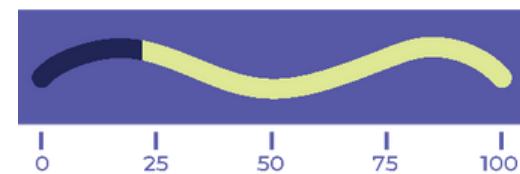

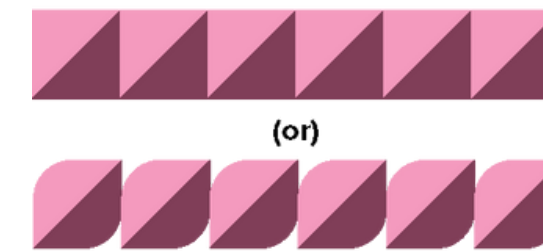
